
# **Fire Stations**



Lake Oswego has four fire stations strategically located throughout the city. Find the fire station nearest you!



## **Main Fire Station**

The Flagship of the Lake Oswego Fire Department, located at 300 B Avenue in downtown Lake Oswego was built in 1995. Response crews staff the upstairs quarters while the majority of Fire Administrative staff use the main floor for day to day operations.

#### **Jean Road Fire Station**

Proudly perched on the corner of Jean Road and Bryant Road, this Fire station was built in 1989 and serves the neighborhoods south of Carman Drive to the Tualatin River and east from Interstate 5 to the Blue Heron neighborhood.

#### South Shore Fire Station

Situated on South Shore Boulevard, this is the oldest of the Lake Oswego Fire Stations still in active service. Built in 1971, the station originally shared space with Lake Oswego Communications (LOCOM) which was later moved to city Hall. The station staffs Paramedic Engine 212 with nine career personnel that work three separate 24 hour shifts.

#### Westlake Fire Station

Nestled in the Northeast corner of West Lake Park, this fire station was built in 1990 and serves the neighborhoods between Boones Ferry and Interstate 5, and north of the Waluga Park area up to Stephenson Drive.
