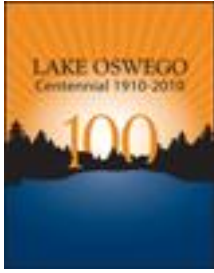


Open City Hall Question on Energy and Water Efficiency
